

COMMITMENT BEYOND CONVENIENCE

THE MASTER'S SEMINARY

The New Testament is filled with examples of ordinary people used by God in extraordinary ways. Timothy became the pastor of an influential church in Asia Minor. Titus ministered on the island of Crete, planting churches and ensuring that they were overseen by qualified elders. Philemon provided the Colossian Church with a place to meet. Epaphroditus was a remarkable example of one who regarded others as more important than himself. And all of these exceptional lives, among many others, were the fruit of the apostle Paul's labors.

Training and teaching others was essential to Paul, but the opportunity to do so was not always convenient. We read in Acts that Paul spent 2–3 years ministering in Ephesus, specifically "reasoning daily in the school of Tyrannus" (Acts 19:9). Based on historical data, Tyrannus was either the founder or the owner of a lecture hall that he made available to traveling teachers. The hall was vacant from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m., when the regular pupils—along with the rest of the city—would have lunch and an afternoon rest. Paul worked when the entire city worked

(Acts 20:33–34), and then taught while the city rested. He was bi-vocational, and it is probable that most of his students were, as well. Though the circumstances were not the most convenient, Paul endured so that "all who lived in Asia heard the word of the Lord, both Jews and Greeks" (Acts 19:10).

The Master's Seminary realizes that often circumstances and responsibilities do not allow men to pursue traditional, full-time studies. But our commitment to teaching and training men extends beyond traditional, full-time hours. As a result, TMS is pleased to announce that we now offer evening classes to train men who, like Paul, must work when the city works and train when the city rests. To encourage men in our own church family to participate, TMS will offer a \$500 credit for all Grace Church members who enroll in the program.
